### **The Awards**

The shortlisted 'Good Citizens' will be invited to an official ceremony in the Mansion House, Dawson Street, Dublin 2 on the 17<sup>th</sup> May 2016. The Winners will be presented with a specially commissioned Good Citizen Award pin designed by one of Ireland's foremost jewellery designers selected by an international panel for high design and technical skill.
