Delivery Methodology

Delivery is online through a combination of experiential live workshops, study groups and online learning. There are no traditional examinations. Continuous assessment is used throughout the programme. Class sizes are small so you can learn in a friendly atmosphere with and from your peers as well as getting to know your tutors.

Learning to Learn

This module is crucial to the acquisition of new skills, knowledge and employability capacities. It is the first module and sets out to review, consolidate and improve learning and study techniques.

- Demonstrate self-reflective skills necessary for autonomous, online/ blended learning.
- Demonstrate motivational and time management skills.
- Identify own learning style and preference and apply this knowledge to enhance a programme of study.

- Take appropriate notes and source and use information.
- Study online and work remotely.

Communications
